Unfortunately, the National Championships were cancelled due to very hot weather, but Ryan completed his test online which he also won. This qualified him for the British Summer Para Dressage Festival to compete in the RDA class where he rode and scored well. We congratulate Ryan for such a successful summer and he is looking forward to competing in many more competitions.

The Group has a number of new primary schools joining our RDA family this coming year proving that RDA is such an important charity for those with learning and physical difficulties. Ponies and horses really do help adults and children if they have muscle weaknesses, lack of confidence, delayed speech, and communication issues and we witness such benefits every year.
